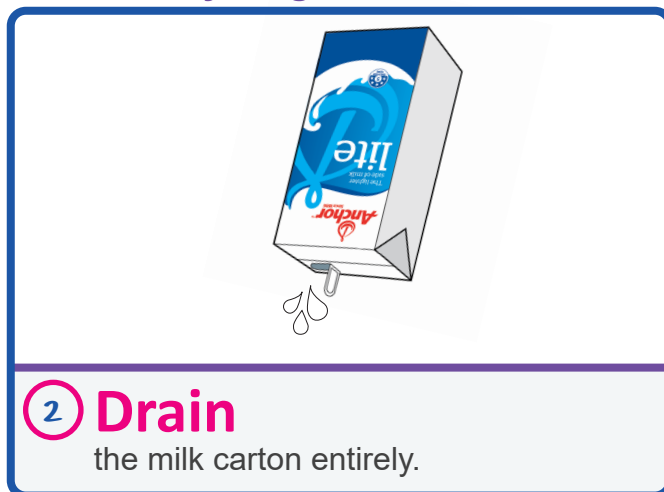
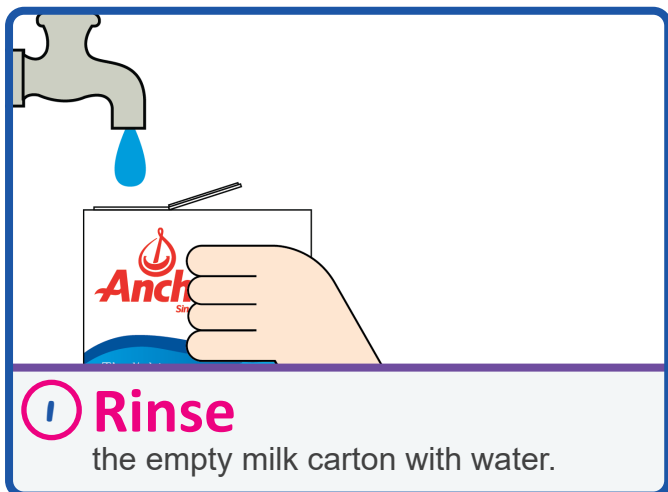


Guide TO RECYCLING

Follow these four steps to correctly prepare your
Anchor™ 1L milk cartons for recycling.



Always let your local Anchor milk team know when you have recycling ready, so collection can be aligned with your next milk delivery.

For Health and Safety reasons your Anchor milk team won't be able to collect recycling that isn't clean and dry. **Please also ensure your recycling bin remains free from rubbish contamination.**

Thank you for your commitment to ensuring your milk cartons are recycled correctly!

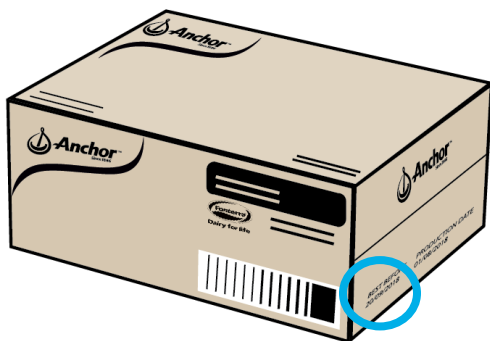

Guide TO STACKING & MILK CASE CARE

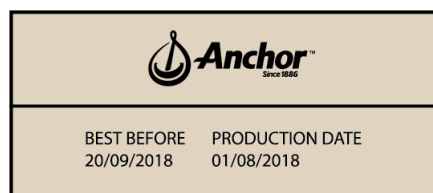
Follow the process below to ensure your milk is stacked correctly.

REMEMBER

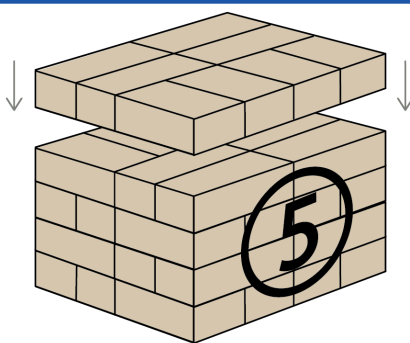
- If another delivery arrives before you have used all the milk from your first delivery, make sure you stack it separately
- Use all the milk from each delivery before you start on the new pile
- If you need to change your milk requirements, please contact the Kickstart Breakfast team to discuss



- 1** 'BEST BEFORE' information is located on the side of the pack. Make sure you can see the 'BEST BEFORE' date when stacking.



- 2** Check the 'BEST BEFORE' date on the milk case and use the case with the earliest date first.



- 3** To make sure your milk cases don't fall over, stack them using the interlock system. For safety, it's best not to stack them more than five cases high.



- 4** If you find a case is damaged or leaking, move it from your pile, and place it to one side with a note saying, 'do not consume'. Call the KickStart Breakfast team to arrange a replacement.

Your recycling CHECKLIST



KickStart Breakfast takes recycling and environment awareness seriously. We ask you to take the time to become familiar with our recycling process and ensure we all do our part to care for the environment.

Recycling your cardboard containers and boxes.

Please use your usual school recycling to recycle the following:

- Cardboard cases that contain your 12 x Anchor™ Milk cartons
- Cardboard cases that contain your 12 x boxes of Sanitarium Weet-Bix™
- Empty Weet-Bix™ boxes

If you don't currently have a cardboard recycling process, please contact your local council for guidance.

Recycling your empty milk cartons

Fonterra will provide you with:

- A smaller 80 litre recycling bin for storing your empty milk cartons. Once they've been rinsed, drained, dried and flattened
- Recyclable bin liners to line the inside of your 80 litre bin
- A larger 240 litre recycle bin. Once your small bin is about two-thirds full, tie off the bag and store this in your large bin

Where should you place the bins?

- We suggest placing the smaller bin in a place that's easy to access, close to where your KickStart Breakfast club is located. Let everyone know it is only for placing clean empty milk cartons!
- Your larger 240 litre bin needs to be kept in the shade in warmer months. Ensure your bin can be easily accessed by your Anchor team.
